Investment objective

The Maestro Equity Prescient Fund will be a general equity portfolio. The Manager in selecting securities for the portfolio will seek to follow an investment policy which will secure for investors an optimum overall return, that is to say the steady growth of income and the preservation of capital in real terms. In order to achieve these main objectives the investments to be acquired for the Maestro Equity Prescient Fund, shall comprise a mix of securities, financially sound ordinary shares, stock, financially sound preference shares, debenture stock, debenture bonds and unsecured notes as defined in the Act and the Deed, all to be acquired at a fair market value.

The Fund benchmark

The Fund will measure itself against the FTSE-JSE All Share Index.
ASISA Classification: South African-Equity-General.

Legal structure

The Fund is a scheme in the nature of a trust known as a collective investment scheme. The portfolio manager is Maestro Investment Management (Pty) Ltd, an approved Financial Services Provider in terms of the Financial Advisory and Intermediary Services Act, operating under license number 739. This portfolio operates as a white label fund under the Prescient unit Trust Scheme, which is governed by the Collective Investment Schemes Control Act.

Fee structure

The maximum initial fee is 2.0%. The annual investment management fee is 1.75%. The annual total expense ratio (TER) for period ended 30 June 2023, in respect of class A was 2.28%.

Market Overview

The primary “game in town” remains the current and future level of US inflation and what the Federal Reserve’s stance will be towards future inflation readings. Fed-speak is still rather aggressive though, and bond yields (interest rates), which are historically an accurate indicator of things to come, continue to rise. Consequently, equity markets remain tentative and cautious ahead of further rate increases by central banks. It is noteworthy that Brazil became the first central bank in the world to lower interest rates, when it did so in August. That event may yet prove to be prescient. To the extent that expectations for higher US interest rates prevail, equity markets will remain nervous, and the dollar remain firm, which in turn affects most other currencies and commodity prices.

The Bloomberg Aggregate Global Bond index declined 1.4% during August, having endured a volatile month. US bonds fared a bit better, declining only 0.6%. Turning to equity markets, the MSCI World index declined 2.6% while the Emerging market index lost 6.4%, a victim of a stronger dollar; the DXY dollar index rose 1.7% during the month. The Chinese equity market lost 5.5% and Hong Kong 8.4%, as concern mounted about the state of the Chinese economy, specifically around the property crisis in that country. While some support measures have been announced by the Chinese authorities, they have done little to allay fears about the property crisis and the slowing growth rate of the country as a whole. The annual return to end-August of the Chinese equity market is -2.6% (-7.8% for Hong Kong), in stark contrast to the annual returns for the MSCI World index of 13.7%, the US 15.9%, Germany 24.3%, and NASDAQ 18.8%. During the past year the MSCI Emerging market index *declined* 1.4%. The US equity market lost 1.6% in August, Germany declined 3.0%, Switzerland 1.6%, and the NASDAQ 2.2%.

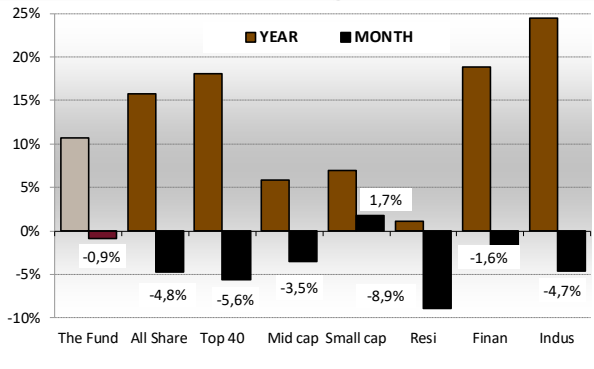

Local market returns

the rand was under some pressure, given the firm dollar, although we must remember that the rand surged 6.2% last month. During August, it declined 6.1%. The All Share index lost 4.8%, dragged lower by the Basic Materials and Industrial indices, which fell 8.9% and 4.7% respectively. The Financial index lost 1.6%. The Large and Mid cap indices lost 5.6% and 3.5% respectively while the Small cap index actually rose 1.7%. The All Bond index declined 0.2%, which is a resilient return given the weak rand and global bond markets. However, it is most probably indicative of the relative attraction of the SA bond market.

Investment Manager comment

The Maestro Equity Prescient Fund declined 0.9% during August, versus the -4.8% All Share index return. This result was partly a function of the Fund’s large offshore exposure – remember the rand lost 6.1% of its value – and an underweight position in the Basic Materials sector. Decliners during the month included Capitec, which lost 11.6% (it rose 14.4% in July though), the Satrix Resources ETF lost 10.6%, Aspen 10.2%, and Discovery 7.1%. Moving on to the gainers during August, the Satrix World and US

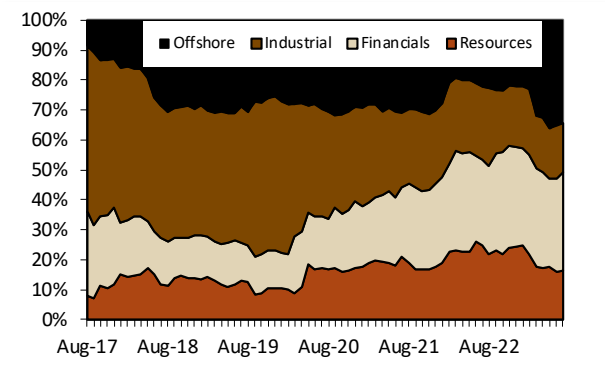
ETFs rose 4.3% and 4.7% respectively, CoreShares S&P500 rose 5.1%, and Stor-Age Property 5.4%.

The Fund has adhered to its Policy objective during the month.

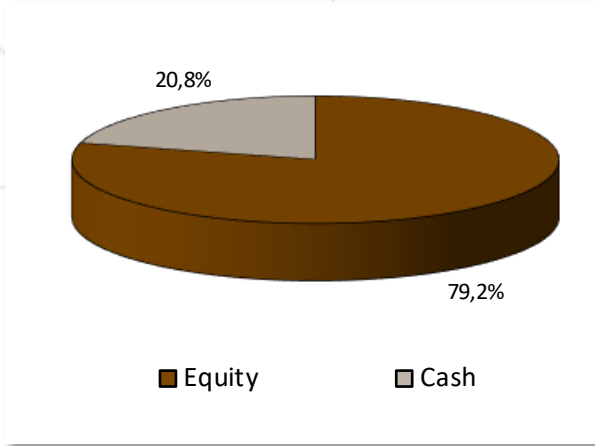
Historic sector allocation (% of Equity)



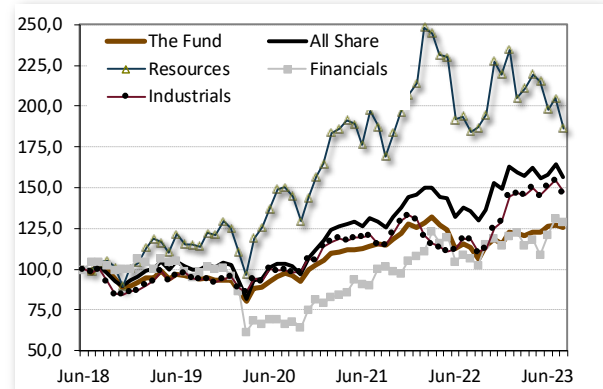
