Minimum Disclosure Document

Investment objective

The Maestro Equity Prescient Fund's objective is to produce above average long-term returns by investing in the South African equity market. It will simultaneously aim to assume less risk than the risk inherent in the market itself. The Fund adopts a conservative investment philosophy. The Fund falls under the South African Equity General ASISA classification as the Fund has a high risk profile.

The Fund benchmark

The Fund will measure itself against the FTSE-JSE All Share Index

Legal structure

The Fund is a scheme in the nature of a trust known as a collective investment scheme. The portfolio manager is Maestro Investment Management (Pty) Ltd, an approved Financial Services Provider in terms of the Financial Advisory and Intermediary Services Act, operating under license number 739. This portfolio operates as a white label fund under the Prescient unit Trust Scheme, which is governed by the Collective Investment Schemes Control Act.

Fee structure

The maximum initial fee is 2.0%. The annual investment management fee is 1.75%. The annual total expense ratio (TER) for period ended 31 December 2015, in respect of class A was 2.06%.

Market Overview

After the trauma and volatility of the first four months of the year, May seemed like a relatively subdued month. Economic data from the world's major regions was mixed, there were no major positive or negative surprises from the major central banks, and currencies weren't too volatile, other than the Brexit-imbued pound.

The MSCI World index rose 0.2%, but the MSCI Emerging Market index fell 3.9%, bringing its annual decline to 19.6% versus the 5.9% decline of the former index. The Japanese market rose 3.4% and the German and US equity markets rose 2.3% and 1.7% respectively. The Hong Kong market fell 1.2%. The Brazilian market fell 10.1%, the Russian market declined 4.9% despite the 5.4% oil price increase and the Chinese equity market fell 0.7%. The Indian market was the standout performer amongst emerging markets, rising 4.1%. Global bond markets were on the back foot in May as the Barclays Capital Global Aggregate Bond index fell 1.3%.

The dollar rose 2.9% and 0.6% against the euro and pound respectively. Its strength against emerging currencies was more pronounced: it rose 10.9%, 5.3% and 4.4% against the rand, the Turkish lira and the Brazilian real. It rose 5.3% against the Australian dollar. Commodity prices were also undermined by the strong dollar, with gold, platinum, palladium and silver falling 3.5%, 6.6%, 12.5% and 7.4% respectively. Copper declined 7.9% and iron ore 23.9%, although agricultural commodity prices rose.



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Local market returns



Turning to local equity markets, the Industrial index led the charge, rising 5.1% in May. The Financial index lost 2.0% and the Basic Material index lost 3.8%. The Gold index lost 10.7%, but it is still up 81.5% so far this year. All of this respective activity led to the All Share index rising 1.8%. The Top40 (large cap) index rose 3.3%, but the Mid and Small cap indices experienced poor months, declining 5.7% and 3.6% respectively. In keeping with global bond markets, the All Bond index was weak, ending the month 1.5% lower.

Investment manager comment

The Fund rose 1.3% slightly underperforming the market during the month. The reasons behind this marginal underperformance are intriguing and more complex than one would imagine. Firstly, SABMiller, which has a 13.4% weighting in the All Share index, rose 12.8% and British American Tobacco, which has a 4.0% weighting, rose 11.3% as the rand weakened significantly. The Fund does not hold these two shares (both trade at very high valuations), which explains a large part of the Fund's underperformance of the All Share index.


Turning to the proverbial "winners and losers" during May, Afrimat led the decliners, falling 11.5%, followed by Woolworths 9.2%, Hudaco 5.9%, OneLogix 8.6% and Firstrand 7.1%. On the upside, Mediclinic rose 6.5%, Ascendis Health rose 7.6%, spurred on by the announcement of two huge offshore deals. CalgroM3 rose 9.8% and competitor Balwin Properties rose 14.4%, after both companies posted excellent results.

Historic sector allocation (% of Equity)




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
